Safety rating

Researching the Euro NCAP safety ratings of the model of car you're thinking of buying could give you greater confidence in its ability to protect all passengers in the event of an accident. Check for aspects such as the number of airbags and their positions, too.

Budget

You should be realistic about how much you're able to spend, and shouldn't pay more than you can comfortably afford if there's a much cheaper model that still satisfies your basic criteria. The price of family cars can vary considerably, but will often be open to negotiation.
