- 2. Phonology: Unlike English, Chinese is a 'tone' language. The pitch of a person's voice distinguishes the meaning of the word. In English changes in pitch express emotion. Most people who have learnt a foreign language believe that learning the language through immersion is the best method. This is the best reason for anyone to study Chinese abroad.
