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Max Payne, ranked PG-13 for violence and foreign language, stars Mark Wahlberg as the title character from the popular electronic game of the exact same name. Having actually never gotten incredibly far in the game, I can easily not vouch for the motion picture's faithfulness to the game that influenced it outside of the subway location that starts the game and plays an very early part in the film. I can state that it was a really good (albeit odd) film.

Max Payne is working as a detective in the Cold Scenario Unit of the New York Police department as he has been because the murder of his spouse and kid some 3 years before the film's starting point. One of the 3 offenders liable is still out there and Max is obsessed with catching him. A snitch working for Max provides him a name leading him to a suspect who spouts cryptic messages about wings provoking Max to go back to the snitch's home throughout a rave-style party for a brand-new lead where he meets Natasha, a woman with wings tattooed on her arm. He takes her back to his apartment to question her about the tattoo but then kicks her out after Natasha makes a tactless opinion about his deceased wife. The following day, Natasha appears dead and in pieces with Max's blood-stained billfold located at the crime scene making him suspect leading in her murder.

When an ex-partner named Alex (portrayed by Donal Logue) tries to help Max and winds up finding a link between the tattoo on Natasha's arm and one located on one of the individuals that murder Max's spouse, he leaves Max a message at work to fulfill him at Max's apartment to review it. Max arrives just to find Alex dead and himself when again suspect.

As the chase for his wife's murder continues, Max comes to be more suspect in the murders but takes care of to find allies in Natasha's assassin sister, Mona (skillfully played by Mila Kunis of "That 70's Program" and "Family Person" popularity) and an Internal Affairs representative named Jim Bravura (played by rapper Ludacris).

Without handing out any of the plot twists, the film has references to Norse Mythology (names of business, clubs, items coming from the Norse legends) which at times are peculiar and in some instances merely plain incorrect in the films try to clarify them. The authors can have gotten rid of these references and it might not have impacted the plot at all.

While not Wahlberg's finest film, the acting is nevertheless tight and all the actors provide impressive performances. Don't hope for a ton of character background though. The film continues to be basically merely directly through action with Max being the only character that a great deal is really learned about in more than a few passing lines of dialogue.
