Test Drives. During the test drive, adjust the seat and mirrors and fasten your seatbelts first to check if you'll be comfortable while driving the vehicle. Turn the ignition and listen for any engine problems. The car should be easy to start, the gears should be easy to shift for manual transmissions, and the vehicle should move smoothly from gear to gear in automatic transmissions. Drive the car in different road conditions for at least thirty minutes to check acceleration, maneuvering, and drivability.

Post-drive Assessment. After the test drive, check the vehicle once more to assess its quality. Open the hood and inspect the engine. Fully functional Indianapolis used cars should not have dripping fluid, billowing smoke, or dirt and grime buildup. Does the engine heat up too fast? Does the smoke smell acrid? Assess the engine after the thirty-minute test drive to determine whether the vehicle passes your standards.
