Perthshire is a huge county and the town of Perth is a great point of departure for seeing the area with its wonderful natural scenery. That said, there is plenty to see in Perth itself, the area which used to be a major town in the 12th century.

Depending on the tour you may also stop at Fowlis Wester, a small village with many ancient sights and Methwen where many interesting and important historical people have resided.

A couple of interesting, if not quirky tours, operate in Perth, including the Perth History and Horror tour. This tour explores the career of John Larg, a career criminal and body snatcher that was executed in Perth in 1817. However, the cheap Perth hotels popular with tourists are not likely to be haunted by ghosts.
