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Working people all over the world need to pay a certain amount of their salary to the government and this amount is known as tax. Paying of tax is necessary for the smooth running of a country. Your safety, your health and everything else could be taken care of by the government with the money you pay as tax and hence paying of taxes do not mean that you are giving up your money instead it means that you are utilizing a part of your money for your own good. But if you find paying taxes are hampering your life to the point of inconvenience you can always go for claiming tax relief from the government. A number of situations are there where the government exempts taxes from its citizens.

One such exemption that you can possibly get is uniform tax rebate. This tax relief is applicable to only people who have uniforms for their work places. But there is a catch; the uniform should be such that you cannot wear it outside of your work. Suppose, you are a manager of a company and your office dress code everyday is suits but you cannot apply for uniform tax rebate until and unless your suits have the company logo on them ie. you cannot wear the suits outside of workplace. Another thing you should know before claiming tax relief is that different professions get different rates of exemptions. For example the amount of uniform tax rebate a carpenter would get is not same as the amount of uniform tax rebate a mine worker would get, even if they have similar kinds of uniforms. There are other conditions too and it is advised that you know about them thoroughly before claiming tax relief based on uniform related issues.

The uniform tax rebate is given as the compensation for the amount you need to spend on buying, washing, repairing and maintaining a uniform and hence you need to prove that you spend money on these before claiming tax relief for your uniform. To know the procedure of claiming tax relief in the legal way you need to consult a tax advisor. There are two ways though for claiming tax relief for uniforms. One is flat rate uniform tax rate rebate and another on is by providing all the bills and receipts for the amount you have spent on your uniform throughout the financial year.
