These advanced tools are commonly included in business telephone systems for larger companies, which require a high number of connections to allow multiple employees to send and receive calls simultaneously, and ensuring that all calls are routed to the right people. If you employ more than 40 individuals, you may consider PBX (private branch exchange) business telephone systems, whereas smaller companies could save money with KSU or keyless systems and fewer connections.

You should consider the potential future growth of your company when comparing phone systems, not just your current situation, as it could prove expensive to replace the entire telecommunications infrastructure of your office premises if you exceed the limitations of your current phone system. Choosing a business telephone system that's flexible and scalable as your business grows or shrinks can be a more cost-effective option.

Another type of phone system that's becoming increasingly popular among businesses in many sectors is VoIP (Voice over Internet Protocol), which delivers calls over business broadband connections rather than over standard phone networks. There can be distinct advantages to VoIP systems, including cheaper rates for international calls as well as higher sound quality and the ability to make use of exclusive tools and features not available over standard phone networks, such as video calls and video conferencing.
